 - a. Presentation: Mayor Friedman and Councilmember Gold on the City's response to COVID-19
 - Mayor Friedman and Councilmember Gold both provided an update on the City's response to COVID-19. Mayor Friedman explained the City falls under the jurisdiction of Los Angeles County Public Health. Mayor Friedman also announced there would be an emergency special City Council meeting to be held on May 22, 2020, to discuss a letter to Governor Gavin Newsom of the State of California requesting to amend the State's health order to allow certain retail and restaurant

establishments to reopen with appropriate safety restrictions in place as soon as possible.
